The research of Dr. Terrance Green, assistant professor of educational leadership and policy at The University of Texas at Austin, examines the crossroads of urban school reform and socially just community development. His work will inform the September Front Porch Gathering, encouraging an exploration of education equity in Austin and how policy in cities can improve educational outcomes in low-income neighborhoods through school and community asset assessment.
